Sacramental Information

Baptism: Infants are regularly baptized at St. Ann Parish at Sunday liturgy or at 12:45 pm on Sunday when a Deacon is available except during Lent. The preferred celebration of the sacrament is with the parish community at weekend masses. Parents are asked to participate in a Baptismal Prep class held on the first Tuesday of every month at 7:00 pm in the Parlour. Please contact Barb Mills in the Parish Office..

First Eucharist/First Reconciliation: Traditionally, preparation for First Reconciliation and First Eucharist happens in second grade with participation in the first grade. However, if your child is older and has not received these Sacraments, please call the office so they we can work with you on this preparation.

Confirmation: The sacrament is conferred in 9th grade. Participation in 8th grade is required. Classes are typically held 2 Sundays a month from 6:00 – 8:00 pm. Please contact Letty Mason in the Parish Office.

Marriage: Couples interested in being married at St. Ann Parish must contact parish office at least 6 months before making other arrangements such as setting dates or contracting for a reception. While it is necessary to contact the parish 6 months prior to the desired date of the wedding, it is advisable to contact the parish 6 months to a year in advance. This will allow time to participate in a marriage preparation program, or if either spouse has been previously married, more time will be needed to seek an annulment. Please call Barb Mills in the Parish Office.

Anointing of the Sick and Dying: If you are scheduled to go to the hospital, it's fitting to be anointed before you go. Anointing of the Sick is held on the third Sunday of the month after all Masses. In case of an emergency, call the parish office or the emergency line 240-500-6285.
